

BF RANKING SCHEMES

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1. OVERVIEW

1.1 PURPOSE OF THE DOCUMENT

The BF National Ranking System is a benefit of membership and provided as a service to Members. This document sets out the rules for each ranking scheme as well as the general principals covering all schemes.

1.2 OWNER

Responsibility for the administration of the ranking schemes lies with the BF Rankings Manager whose decision on any ranking matter shall be final. The ranking scheme in each weapon is carried out to the same rules by the identified ranking co-ordinators.

1.3 PURPOSE OF THE RANKINGS

These ranking schemes are intended to:

Provide a quantitative means for Members to evaluate their performance over time and by comparison with other athletes, across different age groups and experience levels.

Provide data for competition organisers to assist in ranking UK Domestic Events.

Aid selectors where ranking is a component in selection.

1.4 APPLICATION

This version of the scheme rules applies to all Competitions and rankings published from 1st June 2021 and continues in force until replaced.

2. DEFINITIONS

ADP	The BF Athlete Development Program
BRC	British Ranking Competition
BF	British Fencing
Cadet	Under 17 on or after 1st of January of the year when the next Cadet World Championships are to be held. Fencers must be at least 11 on 1st January in order to compete in any UK cadet events in that calendar year.
Commonwealth Championships	The Commonwealth Senior Open Championship.
Competition	A contest between a group of individuals using a single type of weapon (e.g. “Men’s Foil”, “Women’s Sabre”) organised in accordance with BF or FIE rules.
Domestic	Any Competition held in the UK where the ultimate authority is BF. Competitions held in the UK under the auspices of the EFC, FIE or CFF are International.
EFC	European Fencing Confederation
EFC Competition	EFC U17 and U23 Circuit Competition including those held in the UK and the European U23 Championships.
Event	One or more Competitions typically held in the same venue, under the same organising committee over a period of no more than a few consecutive days (e.g. UK Opens, FIE Competitions) and normally intended to be repeated on an annual basis.
FIE	International Fencing Federation
Qualifying International Competition	Any Qualifying FIE Competition, EFC Competition, or the Commonwealth Championships.
International Competitor	An athlete awarded a final place and representing a nation other than GBR irrespective of BF membership.
Junior	Under 20 on or after 1st of January of the year when the next Junior World Championships are to be held.
Multiplier	A numeric value used to reflect the relative strength of the Competition.
Member	A member in good standing of BF holding a licence to compete in the relevant age group.
NIF	A numeric value assigned to an individual to indicate their relative strength within the rankings.
NIF Assignment Date	1 st September, 1 st December, 1 st March and 1 st June each year.
Nominated Competition	A Competition selected for inclusion in a ranking scheme by the appropriate authority.
Open	A single weapon (from the 6 Weapon categories), individual Competition held in the UK which any Senior Member is permitted to enter on payment of the appropriate fee.
Qualifying FIE Competition	Individual Senior Competitions of type “Grand Prix”, “World Cup”, “Satellite”, “World Championship” or “Olympic Games” appearing on the FIE calendar including such Competitions held in the UK.

Rankings Manager	A person appointed by BF to take decisions on ranking issues.
Registered	Approved for registration as a Ranking Competition by BF.
Senior	Open to fencers aged 13 or over on or before the first day of the Competition.
Under 23 or U23	Aged 23 years on or after 1st of January of the year when the next European Championships are to be held.
Under 14 or U14	Under 14 on the 1st January immediately preceding the start of the Season.
6 Weapon	The 6 official weapon categories of competition: Epee-Women, Epee-Men, Foil-Women, Foil-Men, Sabre-Women, Sabre-Men

3. COMMON RULES

The following rules apply to all schemes unless the scheme specifically states otherwise.

3.1 ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY

All Members in good standing and holding an annual Compete licence are entitled to a place on relevant rankings irrespective of nationality or affiliation with another FIE country.

Inclusion on a ranking list does not guarantee eligibility for selection, even in cases where an automatic selection is determined by ranking. Factors such as nationality, fitness and discipline will normally form an integral part of the selection rules and athletes should refer to the selection scheme in question to determine their eligibility.

Any athlete who is subject to suspension for any reason is not entitled to a ranking for the period of suspension (c.f. 3.5).

3.2 COMPETITION ELIGIBILITY

Each individual scheme sets out details of the Competitions which are used to calculate the ranking.

Each Competition shall be counted no more than once in any ranking. Results are included for a period of 12 months or until the date of the same Competition in the following Season, whichever occurs first.

The date of any Competition shall be taken to be the date of the final.

All Competitions must be run in accordance with a standard formula broadly in line with FIE Article o.66 as specified in the BF Competition registration requirements.

3.3 CALCULATIONS

3.3.1 ROUNDING

Percentile limits shall be rounded down to the next lowest whole number. For example, when calculating the 83% limit in a competition with 85 competitors only those ranked 1 to 70 shall be awarded points (83% of 85 is 70.55).

3.3.2 EQUALITY

In case of equality at the percentile limit, both athletes shall be included. For example, given an entry of 10 athletes, equal 8th places and an 83% limit, both athletes placed 8th would be awarded points.

3.3.3 ELIGIBLE RESULTS

Athletes included on the final ranking as 9999, "DNS" or any equivalent position shall not be counted in the number competing for any purpose nor shall they be awarded any points.

Athletes awarded a numbered final place, including those with the annotation "DNF", shall be awarded the points due to their final place.

3.3.4 RANKING METHOD

Athletes will be ranked in descending order of total points scored starting at rank number 1.

Where two or more athletes have the same number of points, they will be assigned an equal ranking.

The positions following any equality shall be calculated as if no equal rankings existed. For example, after two athletes placed 10th equal, the following ranking assigned shall be 12th.

3.4 CORRECTIONS AND CLARIFICATIONS

All correction and clarification requests should be notified within 2 working days of publication to rankings@britishfencing.com. For monthly rankings, the aim is to resolve queries before the 10th of each month after which the rankings will be deemed confirmed and available for use in selection. For rankings published per Competition, the aim is to resolve queries before any subsequent selection date.

Except in the case of retroactive penalties (c.f. 9) or corrections within the time limits above, no published ranking or competition points allocation shall be updated. Any pre-publication events such as the addition of late results or suspension of an athlete shall be included in the first publication after the event is notified to the Rankings Manager.

3.5 SUSPENDED ATHLETES

Any athlete whose membership is suspended or cancelled shall not be entitled to appear on any ranking with a calculation date falling within the period of suspension or after the date of cancellation.

All rankings calculated before the start of the period of suspension shall remain unaltered.

All results submitted before the start of the period of suspension shall remain unaltered.

A suspended athlete shall resume eligibility to appear on rankings with a calculation date after their period of suspension ends.

Any result submitted which includes a suspended athlete shall be rejected.

If a period of suspension is in effect at 00:01 on a NIF Assignment Date, a suspended athlete shall not be included in any recalculation of NIF values.

An athlete who was excluded from a previous calculation of NIF points shall not be awarded any NIF value until the first scheduled calculation following the end of their period of suspension.

3.6 DUTIES OF COMPETITION ORGANISERS

Organisers must ensure that all athletes are in possession of current BF membership which includes a licence to enter Ranking Competitions in the relevant age category.

N.B. Overseas Athletes are required to have a valid temporary BF membership. For details of how to obtain a temporary licence number which will entitle the holder to compete, please see the BF website.

Organisers must provide BF with a complete and accurate set of results from first to last place as soon as possible and in any event no later than 23:59 on the first Wednesday following the final.

Results submitted after the deadline and up to 30 days from the date of the Competition may be included subject to a penalty (c.f. 9) and at the discretion of the Rankings Manager.

All results must include valid BF Membership or temporary licence numbers for all competitors.

Results must be submitted using the sport:80 event management website, details of which are supplied to all Registered Competition organisers.

Competitions which do not conform to these requirements will be subject to a penalty or exclusion (c.f. 9).

4. CADET RANKING SCHEME

4.1 THE CADET SEASON

The Season starts with the first Nominated Competition after each Cadet World Championships and ends with the next Cadet World Championships.

4.2 CADET RANKING POINTS

4.2.1 QUALIFYING RESULTS

Athletes may score points in Nominated Competitions for the current season only. The calendar of Nominated Competitions together with indicative multipliers (c.f. 4.4) is published on the BF website no later than 10 working days before the first Nominated Competition.

Some Competitions may be designated as Development Competitions and these will be eligible for ranking points at a lower multiplier (c.f. 4.4.3).

The athlete's overall points total is the sum of their best **SIX** results of which no more than **FOUR** can be international results.

4.2.2 CARRY OVER

35% of the points earned in each end of season ranking will be carried forward to the start of the following season by way of a Carry Over Competition result.

The Carry Over Competition will be treated as an International Competition and will be valid to a date specified by BF to be published on the BF website no later than 10 days before the first Nominated Competition.

4.2.3 U14 TRANSITION BONUS

Athletes who do not have **THREE** results scoring more than zero points in the most recent end of season ranking shall be awarded a transition bonus using the results at the most recent BYC Under 14 Championships. The points awarded shall be calculated using the normal scale with a Competition multiplier of 0.75.

Athletes who did not compete in the most recent BYC U14 Championship shall not be awarded a transition bonus.

U14 Transition Bonus points shall be included in the Carry Over Competition (c.f. 4.2.2). Where an athlete has both Carry Over and U14 Transition Bonus points, only the higher of the two shall be awarded.

4.3 PUBLICATION SCHEDULE

In each season the following rankings shall be published:

A start of season ranking, taking into account any carry over and transition bonus, no later than 30 days after the end of the previous season.

An updated ranking after each Nominated Competition.

The ranking published following the Cadet World Championships will be deemed the End of Season ranking.

4.4 METHOD OF CALCULATING POINTS

Points are calculated according to the round reached e.g. L512, L256, L128, L64, L32 etc and for each place in the last 8, multiplied by the Competition multiplier and rounded down to the nearest whole number.

Points are awarded to athletes finishing in the top 80% of Domestic Competitions and the top 70% of International Competitions (c.f. 3.3.1).

4.4.2 DOMESTIC COMPETITION MULTIPLIERS

Domestic Competition multipliers are set by the ADP team. Indicative multipliers are published on the BF website and may change before the Competition. Indicative multipliers will not be changed later than 5 working days before the Competition start date.

The final multiplier will be confirmed after the Competition and published on the BF website.

Domestic Competition multipliers will normally be in the range 1.0 to 3.0.

4.4.3 INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION MULTIPLIERS

International Competitions vary significantly in size and strength therefore International Competition Multipliers are determined based on the number of International Fencers given a final place and may be adjusted to reflect unusual strength or weakness.

The initial multiplier will be:

An adjustment between -2 and +2 to the calculated multiplier may be made to reflect the strength of the Competition.

The final multiplier including any adjustment will be confirmed and published on the BF website after each Competition.

5. JUNIOR RANKING SCHEME

5.1 THE JUNIOR SEASON

The Season starts with the first Nominated Competition after the Junior World Championships and ends with the next Junior World Championships.

5.2 JUNIOR RANKING POINTS

5.2.1 QUALIFYING RESULTS

Athletes may score points in Nominated Competitions only. The calendar of Nominated Competitions together with indicative multipliers (c.f. 5.4) is published on the BF website no later than 10 working days before the first Nominated Competition.

Some Competitions may be designated as Development Competitions and these will be eligible for ranking points at a lower multiplier (c.f. 5.4.3).

The athlete's overall points total is the sum of their best **SIX** results of which no more than **FOUR** results may be from International Competitions.

5.2.2 BRC COMPETITION REPLACEMENT ORDER

Junior BRC Competitions will be treated as homogeneous and will not be subject to the "Same Competition" replacement rule. Each Junior BRC Competition will therefore be valid for 12 months from the Competition date.

All other Nominated Competitions shall be replaced as normal (c.f. 3.2).

5.2.3 CADET TRANSITION BONUS

Athletes who do not have **THREE** results scoring more than zero points in the end of season ranking shall be awarded 10% of the points earned in the most recent End of Season Cadet ranking by way of a Carry Over Competition.

For the avoidance of doubt, points awarded in the Carry Over Competition shall be subject to the normal rounding rules (c.f. 3.3.1).

The Carry Over Competition shall be deemed to take place one day after the End of Season ranking calculation date and shall be valid to a date specified by BF, normally before the first Nominated International Competition.

The Carry Over Competition shall be treated as a Domestic Competition.

5.3 PUBLICATION SCHEDULE

In each season the following rankings shall be published:

A start of season ranking, taking into account any transition bonus, no later than 30 days after the end of the previous season.

An updated ranking after each Nominated Competition.

The ranking published following the Junior World Championships shall be deemed the End of Season ranking.

5.4 METHOD OF CALCULATING POINTS

Points are calculated according to the round reached e.g. L512, L256, L128, L64, L32 etc and for each place in the last 8, multiplied by the Competition multiplier and rounded down to the nearest whole number.

Points are awarded to athletes finishing in the top 80% of Domestic Competitions and the top 70% of International Competitions.

5.4.2 DOMESTIC COMPETITION MULTIPLIERS

Domestic Competition multipliers are set by the ADP team. Indicative multipliers are published on the BF website and may change before the Competition. Indicative multipliers will not be changed later than 5 working days before the Competition start date.

The final multiplier will be confirmed after the Competition and published on the BF website no later than 2 working days after each Competition.

Domestic Competition multipliers will normally be in the range 1.0 to 3.0.

5.4.3 INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION MULTIPLIERS

International Competitions vary significantly in size and strength therefore International Competition Multipliers are determined based on the number of International Fencers given a final place and may be adjusted to reflect unusual strength or weakness.

The initial multiplier will be:

An adjustment between -2 and +2 to the calculated multiplier may be made to reflect the strength of the Competition.

The final multiplier including any adjustment will be confirmed and published on the BF website after each Competition.

6. SENIOR RANKING SCHEME

6.1 THE SEASON

The Season starts on 1st September each year and runs until the following 31st August.

6.2 QUALIFYING RESULTS

Athletes may score points in any Registered Open Competition or Qualifying International Competition.

6.3 CALCULATION OF POINTS

Calculation of the ranking points will normally be done on a monthly basis in the first week of each month using the actual results of relevant competitions during the period of twelve months ending on the last day of the previous month.

Points on the normal scale are awarded to Athletes who are placed in the top 83% of those competing and 1 point is awarded to those placing lower.

The points scored in each competition are calculated by taking the grading multiplier and multiplying this by the factor assigned to each final placing (c.f. 6.5) and then rounding down to the nearest whole number.

The Athlete's overall points total is the sum of their best **SIX** results of which no more than **FOUR** results may be from International Competitions.

At least **ONE** result must be from an Open Competition or the Senior British Championships unless the athlete holds a current FIE licence for GBR.

6.4 GRADING MULTIPLIERS

6.4.1 Method of Calculation

6.6 CALCULATION OF NIF FOR MEMBERS

NIF values shall be assigned to Members based on their weapon and position in the Senior ranking list on each NIF Assignment Date. The NIF assigned shall be used to calculate the grading multiplier for Competitions until the next NIF Assignment Date.

The ranking range used for each weapon is set to reflect the number of Members on the ranking list, using approximately 5%, 10%, 23% and 45% of the expected number of Athletes for the 10, 6, 3 and 1 bands respectively.

6.7 CALCULATION OF NIF FOR OVERSEAS ATHLETES

Overseas Athletes participating in Opens will be assigned a notional NIF value based on the NIF of Members finishing below them in the final ranking.

Only NIFs allocated to Members on the most recent ranking shall be included for the purposes of calculating a notional NIF.

The notional NIF calculated shall be valid only for the single Competition and shall not influence future calculations.

7. UNDER 23 RANKING SCHEME

7.1 QUALIFYING COMPETITIONS

Athletes may score points in all Senior Ranking Competitions (c.f. 6.2) and the U23 National Championships.

7.2 QUALIFYING ATHLETES

Athletes who meet the age criteria at the calculation date are eligible for the U23 ranking.

For the avoidance of doubt, athletes' eligibility for the U23 ranking will change on 1st January each year and only athletes eligible on the calculation date shall be included in any ranking.

7.3 CALCULATION OF POINTS

The athlete's overall points total is the sum of their best **SIX** results of which no more than **FOUR** results may be from International Competitions.

7.3.1 U23 NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

Points for the U23 National Championships shall be awarded using the Senior ranking scale and a fixed grading multiplier of 300.

The U23 National Championships is a Domestic Event and will be treated as such.

7.3.2 JUNIOR TRANSITION BONUS

Athletes who do not have **THREE** results scoring more than one point in the 1st August Senior Ranking each year and have earned points in the immediately preceding Junior end of season rankings will be awarded 10 times their Junior points total on each 1st September by way of a Carry Over Competition.

This Carry Over Competition will count as an International Competition for the purposes of U23 ranking and will be treated the same as other International Competitions.

8. INTERMEDIATE RANKING SCHEME

The Intermediate ranking is standalone scheme intended for development purposes and to seed the GB Cup or other national Intermediate Competitions. There is no intention of creating an equivalency between it and other rankings, e.g. it will not be possible to say that #1 in the Intermediate ranking is equivalent to #50 in the Senior ranking.

8.1 QUALIFYING COMPETITIONS

The Intermediate ranking will be constructed using points earned in Registered Open Competitions having a ratio of grading multiplier (c.f. 6.4) to competing athletes less than or equal to 1.80 (rounded down to nearest .01).

8.2 CALCULATION OF POINTS

The athlete's overall points total is the sum of their best **SIX** results using the points awarded to Qualifying Competitions (c.f. 8.1).

BF reserve the right to reduce or remove ranking points from any Competition for matters not covered by these rules.

* An Event or Competition to which a penalty is applied will not be entitled to automatic renewal of its "Registered" status and will need to reapply for the following Season.

* Following any penalty on safety grounds the Event shall be required to accept a BF appointed observer as a condition of registration for one or more future years at the discretion of BF. All expenses of the observer including travel, accommodation and per-diem shall be borne by the Event.
