- Largest youth participation event in the UK
- Qualification through Regions, compete for your Region
- Friendly atmosphere and a chance to meet new fencing friends!



# How can I help my Fencer to prepare?

- Chat at Club/with Coaches of what to expect – know how to clip on/off and how to read/sign poule/results sheets
- Large arena with lots of people, it may be noisy and busy
- Multi use venue – other users
- Pistes split over two arenas (athletics and netball halls)
- Hidden Disabilities

# What should we bring to the event?

- Reusable water bottle
- Spare equipment (must go onto piste with at least 2 working weapons and 2 body wires) equipment rules on webpage
- Snacks – café on site
- Change of clothes

- Respectful to officials and volunteers

# What to do on the day

- Check in at the check in desk
- Find a space to warm up
- Check the results screens/online results to see where you should be and when
- Spectator seating areas in both arenas

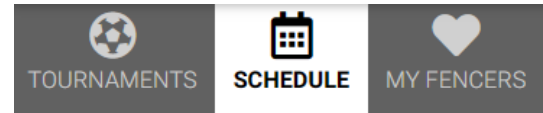
# How do I know what's going on?

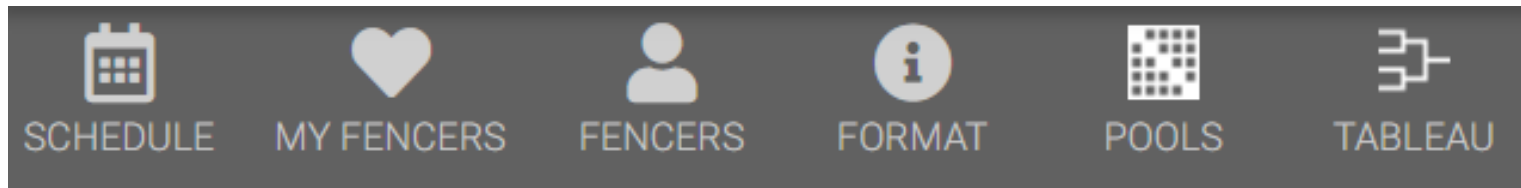

# FencingTimeLive

- Top Navigation bar – Fencers, Format and Poulés. More tabs appear (Tableau and Results) as the competition progresses



# FencingTimeLive

- Poules – Shows Poule Number and Strip (Piste) Number. Your fencer needs to be at that piste 5 minutes before then and ready for the referee to check their equipment
- Once the poule is complete, all fencers sign the referees poule sheet to confirm their scores, this then goes back to DT (Event HQ) to be inputted into the results, then the results of the poules show

# FencingTimeLive

- When all poules are complete, at the BYCs, all fencers progress to DE (Direct Elimination)
- Tableau will show the fencers against each other and then the piste, time and referee.
- This moves to the right with each round (Round = Table)

# Accreditation – do I need it?

- Parents and carers can get very close to the field of play
- Recommended only for those giving coaching during minutes break
- Fencers can come to meet you at the Field of Play Edge
- U12 events – allowed to assist to clip on and then move outside the barriers

# What do I do if I have a question on the day?

- Staff and Volunteers are on hand to help – British Fencing uniform or high vis jackets
- Check in Desk/Accreditation area
- Referees – Here to help fencers with questions and explain decisions
